## Agency response

I-70 runs through St. Charles and essentially divides the city in half, north & south. The interstate, aside from carrying interstate traffic, is the main artery carrying daily commuter traffic from St. Charles and west of St. Charles to the Greater St. Louis area. St. Charles also contains two highly traveled state highways, Hwy 94 & Hwy 370, which also serve as main arterial routes as well as feeding I-70's local, regional and interstate traffic. State Hwy 364, to a lesser degree, impacts traffic volume in the city. St. Charles is the County Seat of St. Charles County and contains the County Jail, County Courts Bldg. and all of the county's administrative offices. All such business conducted in person with county government is processed in St. Charles and greatly contributes to traffic in the city's core business area. The Historic Main Street District in the heart of St. Charles has many daily attractions and is the site of approx. 75 festivals & special events, drawing crowds from hundreds of miles. The 2 largest festivals, July 4th and the Little Hills Festival in August, have attendance of nearly 100,000. St. Charles has its own convention center; the St. Charles Family Arena w/ seating for over 11,000 causing traffic through the city; the Ameristar Casino draws 10.5 million annually (w/ gaming & other entertainment programs) and is one of the city's biggest employers; and Lindenwood University has a residential population of approx. 3500 students and serves 6,000 commuters.
