Dear Father:

Your letter of June 5th requesting an opinion of this office is in words and figures as follows:

"We are planning to have a picnic here similar to the one at which you spoke in Abolt two summers ago. Now in case we should decide to have for sale the modern 3.2%, would we have to pay the same amount as any retail company for a permit?"

Be assured that a good number of the community here are behind your activities in the state."

I am very sorry but after a thorough study of the recent beer law, we are of the opinion that to retail beer at your picnic would require a Missouri state license, as a condition precedent, if the law of this state be complied with, and the cost to you would be the same as required of any dealer.
