Dear Sir:

Your letter of July 27th reads as follows:

"I would like an opinion from your office as to whether or not I should abide by the President's Reemployment Agreement in full, dated July 27, 1933, or does this agreement apply to state employees?"

"Does it mean that I should increase the number of employees, and reduce the number of working hours? Our Samplers and Weighers are employed on an eight hour day basis, but, in reality, work but four or five hours?"

The employees of the State Warehouse Commission's Department are not, in the opinion of this department, within the terms of the National Industrial Recovery Act.
