

COUNTY TREASURER - Laws Mo. 1933, p. 357 do not apply to
Randolph County.

Dear Sir:

We have your request as to whether House
Bill 315, Laws of Missouri 1933, p. 357, applies to
a county such as Randolph, whose population is 26,431.

In answer to your inquiry, we quote Section 1,
Laws of Missouri 1933, p. 357, which is as follows:

"From and after the first day
of January, 1937, the office
of County Treasurer shall be
abolished in all counties of
this state, which now contain,
or may hereafter contain, 75000
inhabitants and not more than
90000 inhabitants, according
to the last decennial census
of the United States."

It is, therefore, the opinion of this office
that Randolph County does not come within the provisions
of the above law relating to counties containing 75000
to 90000 inhabitants, as determined by the census.
