


**INSURANCE: Articles of Incorporation of Capitol Mutual Casualty  
Insurance Company.**

Opinion No. 208

Dear Mr. Duggins:

In compliance with your request of May 22, 1964, an executed copy of the original Articles of Incorporation of the proposed Capitol Mutual Casualty Insurance Company, together with proof of publication of the same as required by Section 379.030 RSMo 1959, have been reviewed by this office pursuant to the directive contained in Section 379.220 RSMo 1959.

A deficiency on the face of the Articles of Incorporation is noted in their failure to disclose, as required by Section 379.210 RSMo 1959, "the names and addresses of those composing the board of directors in which the management shall be vested until the first meeting of the members". Such deficiency, not going to powers granted, is not deemed a legal impediment to issuance of the certificate here granted.

It is the opinion of this office that the Articles of Incorporation of the proposed Capitol Mutual Casualty Insurance Company, to be organized pursuant to Sections 379.205 to 379.310 RSMo 1959, as amended, are in accordance with the provisions of said cited statutes, and not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this State and the United States.
