Dear Sir:

A request for an opinion has been received from you under date of October 29, 1935, such request being in the following terms:

"Recently I was presented with a schedule pertaining to proper charges and fees in State Highway Condemnation cases.

This schedule was set up by Mr. Wilkie B. Cunninghem, Assistant Attorney for the State Highway Department.

I agree with Mr. Cunningham on many of the items of costs which he discusses in this form, but with some of the items I differ.

I am enclosing the schedule as I received it and I will appreciate an opinion from your department as to the authority of Mr. Cunningham's interpretation."

The memorendum which you sent us beers date of August 1, 1935, and is addressed as a memorandum to Mr. Stigall, and consists of seventeen mimeographed pages. We have examined such memorandum and have checked the statutes and cases cited therein and in our opinion such memorandum shows every evidence of careful and thorough investigation and preparation, and we find no material errors in the specific items of costs set out therein which would concern you in your official capacity. Of course, under the statutes Mr. Cunnyngham's rulings are not binding on circuit courts or clerks thereof, as the Legal Department of the State High-

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way Commission is not your legal adviser, but, on the other hand, neither is this Department, which is only authorized by statute to give formal opinions to certain designated officials of this State, of which a Clerk of the Circuit Court is not one (R.S. Mo., 1929, Section 11274). Consequently, this answer to your letter requesting an opinion on "the authority of Mr. Cunnyngham's interpretation" must be accepted with this qualification.
