Baul meratonin-Wairia & Deposits. February 10, 1933 Hon. O. H. Moberly, Commissioner of Finance. Jefferson City, Missouri. Dear Mr. Moberly: As far as moratoriums in Missouri are concerned, at the present time their status is either that of a voluntary agreement or an arbitrary ruling

without legal authority.

In the event such agreement is made by a part of the depositors of the bank, the remainder of the depositors are not bound, and upon the opening of the bank, the depositors who did not sign a waiver or otherwise become parties to the agreement for a moratorium are not bound and would be entitled to demand and be paid the full amount of his or her deposit upon demand.
