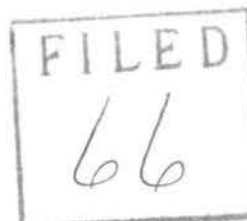

Dear Sir:

Your letter of May 1 requesting an opinion from this office is in words and figures as follows:

"Suppose a railroad company has a permit to sell beer on the premises; that is, on its trains. Will this permit allow the permittee to sell beer, not only in the dining car, but also in the observation and other cars on the same train on which the dining car is being operated?"

It is the opinion of this office, under the recent beer law, a railroad company having a permit to sell beer on the premises, having obtained said license for its train, may sell said beer not only in the dining car but also in the observation and other cars on the same train on which the dining car is being operated.
