Dear Sir:

We have your request of August 20, 1938 for an opinion as follows:

"Will you please advise and without preparing a lengthy opinion, whether or not the following facts, if put into effect would be in violation of any of our statutes:

> "An automobile dealer, in order to promote his business, on each car that is sold to a customer the serial number is placed in a box and at the end of each week a drawing is made and the party whose number is drawn, his money is returned to him."

The above facts, if put into operation, would be a violation of the lottery statute, Section 4314, R. S. Mo. 1929, since the scheme would include prize, chance and consideration, the three essential elements of lottery.
